#### 7. Report of Committees

- a. <u>Education/Outreach</u> Katie reported on the last education/outreach subcommittee meeting based on Emily Sheridan's notes.
  - July 17<sup>th</sup> Arboretum stormwater reduction benefits were shared on a SLELO PRISM webinar that had 21 registrants
  - Sept 16<sup>th</sup>- Annual trash bash event had 5 volunteers that picked up 155 pounds of trash, and discussed benefits of litter removal for water quality.
  - September 2020 A 10-year progress report on actions that have improved water quality in the watershed, including stormwater coalition activities, was completed by Tug Hill Commission and DEC's Great Lakes program, and a webinar presenting on accomplishments was held on Sept 29<sup>th</sup>, with 41 attendees. The <u>recording of the presentation</u> has had 66 views. The report was finalized with feedback in December 2020.
  - November 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Arbor day celebration and tree planting event at Thompson park included sharing information about stormwater pollution control benefits of trees, and there were over 65 participants.

For 2021, the committee had several ideas, most immediately to put up the Stormwater Coalition education and outreach poster at outdoor kiosks in the coalition communities. Please let Chris know if your community would like additional posters to display in any public places in your community ASAP.
